It is with a mixture and sadness and hope that I share my resignation as Synod Vice-President with you, effective April 15th, 2023.

I know many want to jump to details, but let me instead share a story with you.

Last year, on a perfectly clear evening, the electricity running to our home suddenly went out. It remained inexplicable until the next morning, when, upon my walk with our Irish Setter, his nose led us to the unfortunate cause: our beloved neighborhood Great Horned Owl, who roosted in the creek-side trees, lay perished beneath the pole supporting the electric transformer. Since that morning — as one does not easily forget the sight of a Great Horned Owl lying in your yard — I have pondered on more than one occasion about sudden ends.
