#### **LOVE like Jesus**

### **ENGAGE like Jesus**

Engagement, defined as "to occupy the attention or efforts of another," helps us build deeper relationships within our churches and the greater community, allowing us to understand and respond to those who are hurting. It invites us to participate in God's ongoing work and respond to the Spirit's call. To effectively engage, we must remain rooted in God's love and tend to our own wounds, using contemplative practices to notice God's movement and the Spirit's guidance.
